

**Game:** Children form a line. One end player stands still, and the player at the other end moves in a wide circle, slowly winding the line up tight around the stationary person. After all are wound up tight, the outer coil wheels sharply in a contrary direction and all follow, retracing their steps.

Grade level: K-1

**Game:** Seated circle. One child is the donkey. The donkey has a blanket on his back with a basket on it. As the song is sung, the donkey "walks" around the inside of the circle (crawling), trying to keep the basket from falling. After singing the song, children in the circle put "cargo" in the basket. The object is to keep the basket from falling while the song continues...

#### **Game:** Longways sets of partners


Verse 1 – Head girl skips outside both lines and back in place


